1	Infrastructure	P&RD	MGNREGA	The Project Director DRDA presented the progress of the physical and financial status of MGNREGA schemes Block wise for the financial year 2024-25 and 2025-26. As per the report of physical progress, Borobazar Block achieved 44.43 %, Manikpur Block achieved 101.58% and Sidli-Chirang Block achieved 78.89% compared to the State's average which is 18.59%.	
			Amrit Sarovar	The PD DRDA presented the progress of Amrit Sarovar schemes to the house. He informed that Total 76 nos of schemes have been taken up in Chirang district. 23 nos of schemes falls under the Forest area and remaining 53 falls under Revenue villages. Plantation and fencing with a working shed has been completed against 53 nos of schemes.	
			PMAY-G	The PD, DRDA informed the house that physical and financial progress of PMAY-G houses up to FY 2024-25 as on 3-06-2025. As per report, 6412 nos. of PMAY-G houses are under construction in Chirang district covering Borobazar, Manikpur and Sidli-Chirang Block.

The District Commissioner instructed the EE PHE to coordinate with APDCL and provide electricity connection from the Transformer of PHE department to the One Stop center.</p> <p>The EE also presented the status of Har Ghar Jal declaration and certification in the district. Presently, 76 villages have been covered so far under Har Ghar Ja programl. The EE also stated that 100% water supply has been provided in all schools of Chirang district and 99.31% water supply has been provided in Anagnwadi centres. The EE also informed the house that proposals have been submitted to the concerned authority already for coverage of 75 numbers of AWCs who have been left out.</p>	
3	Education	IS/DEEO		<p>1. The IS informed the house that the progress of various schemes taken up under the Elementary and Secondary Education in Chirang district. He also informed the house regarding the number of sanctioned posts which are lying vacant in the Inspector of Schools Office.</p> <p>2. The IS apprised the house regarding the requirement of 14 toilet houses for boys and 18 toilet houses for girls in some Elementary schools in the district. He also stated that temporary toilet facilities are available in all 32 numbers of Elementary</p>	

				<p>schools.</p> <p>3. The IS also presented the progress of School Uniform distribution to 64552 numbers of students from class 1-8. He also stated that 1193 numbers of 1st div holders in HS final year from Arts, Science and Commerce streams will be provided with Scooty.</p> <p>The District Commissioner instructed the IS to make arrangements for providing of driving license in advance for the students.</p> <p>The IS further informed the house that a total number of 100 schools have been selected for adoption under the School Adoption Programme. Various officers from several departments have already adopted the schools for all round development of the school.</p>	
4	Economic Development	Forest		<p>The DFO, Chirang apprised the availability of sapling in Chirang District. The District Commissioner instructed all HoD and Sub divisional level offices to plant trees in each office campus and instructed to collect saplings from DFO office, Chirang.</p> <p>The District Commissioner informed that Street Play will be done in Borobazar and Runikata area in view of World Environment Day. He Requested all the HoDs to participate in the program. The District Commissioner instructed the DFO to provide 15000 saplings to the Inspector of School. He also requested to upload the plantation programme in the portal.</p>	
5	Social Sector	Health		<p>The Joint Director presented the status of the ongoing Health Programs under the department such as JSSK, NTEP, NLEP, NMHP, NBCP. The Joint Director also shared about</p>	

				<p>various services provided by the department such as free diagnostics, delivery, and medicines distribution. He further informed the house that dengue and JE cases have been tracked in the district and ongoing surveillance and awareness efforts are in place.</p> <p>The Joint Director also informed the house about other key activities taken up by the department and some major challenges faced while conducting control programs of Vector Borne Diseases. The major issues observed are superstition in endemic areas, poor socio-economic, lack of net usage, non-cooperation from some Adivashi communities, high number of transient populations (difficult to trace) and wildlife (elephants) displacing people, forcing them to sleep outdoors. The Joint Director further informed the house regarding the number of vacancies in sanctioned posts and highlighted that some sub-centres are non-functional due to absence of staff.</p>	
6	Infrastructure	PWD (B)		<p>The Executive Engineer (EE), PWD (Building), Chirang presented the progress and current status of various departmental schemes being implemented under multiple government heads of accounts. The Executive Engineer shared the physical and financial progress of key infrastructural projects across various departments and informed the house of both ongoing and completed infrastructure development projects. The EE also informed the house of the ongoing model village development projects undertaken in the district under Axom Adarsha Gram Yojana (2022–23).</p>

				<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. A total of 1055 AWCs are established in Chirang District 2. In the Chirang district for the year 2024–25, Hot Cooked Meals (HCM) were provided to children aged 3 to 6 years at 100 grams per day for a total of 50 days, while Take Home Ration (THR) was supplied for the same duration—50 days—to pregnant women and lactating mothers at 140 grams per day, and to children aged 6 months to 3 years at 100 grams per day. All projects have received SNP food items from BTC and HCM through the AWC-MC account <p>As per the POSHAN Tracker Beneficiary Details as on 30th May 2025, a total of 42,961 beneficiaries have been recorded across two projects in Chirang district. In the Borobazar project, there are 20,429 beneficiaries, which include 620 lactating mothers, 689 pregnant women, 675 children aged 0–6 months, 5,825 children aged 6 months to 3 years, 10,217 children aged 3 to 6 years, and 2,403 adolescent girls. In the Sidli-Chirang project, there are 22,532 beneficiaries, comprising 560 lactating mothers, 711 pregnant women, 659 children aged 0–6 months, 6,120 children aged 6 months to 3 years, 11,629 children aged 3 to 6 years, and 2,853 adolescent girls.</p>
